### A BILL

#### Entitled "Local Government Protection Act of 2005"

*Be it enacted in the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled:*

Section 1: No writ may be issued by any federal court that requires the creation, the continuance, or the funding of any governmental program except in cases where the said program is mandated by an act or Congress. This prohibition shall be observed with respect to all jurisdictions of government including municipalities, counties, and states.

Section 2: All writs issued by federal courts prior to the enactment of this Act, that require the creation, the continuance, or the funding of governmental programs which are not mandated by Congress, are hereby declared to be void and shall no longer be legally binding.

Section 3: Any infraction of Section 1 of this Act by a federal judge or panel of federal judges shall constitute a civil rights violation against the government officials to whom the writs are sent, for which the culpable judge(s) may be subject to fines and personally liable in civil courts.

Section 4: Maximum and minimum penalties for violations (to be determined).

Section 5: The Supreme Court is hereby denied appellate jurisdiction to hear or determine any claim that the enforcement of this law violates any article or amendment to the Constitution of the United States (per Article 3, Section 2 of the Constitution), Likewise, No court established by Act of Congress shall have jurisdiction to

hear or determine any claim that the enforcement of this law violates any article or amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

Section 6: The Supreme Court is hereby denied authority to issue any ruling, in its original jurisdiction, declaring that this law violates any article or amendment to the Constitution of the United States unless the ruling is made by unanimous decision.

Section 7: All provisions of this Act shall become effective on the date of enactment.
